
Budd-ha (noun)

- Siddhartha gave up his life and searched for enlightenment.




alms (noun)

- He carried a small bowl for <u>alms.</u>




nir-van-a (noun)

- He meditated about how to reach <u>nirvana.</u>




eightfold path (noun)
